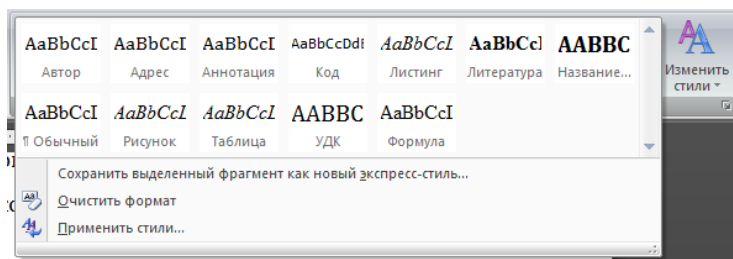


Fig. 1. Figure Title in English

## Supplementary Guidelines for Paper Formatting

The reference list should include at least 3-4 sources – credible references (peer-reviewed academic journals, books from academic publishers), prioritizing articles from Russian and international journals from the last 5-10 years, preferably indexed in RSCI.

The order of references should follow the chronology of their mention in the text.

***Citations of English sources (use official titles of articles and journals in English)***

***For Russian sources without official English titles, use transliteration***

The article text should be structured as follows:

**1. For theoretical articles** reviewing existing theoretical knowledge or practical experience:

- Introduction (relevance of the research topic, problem definition and explanation)
- Research Methodology (literature review – analysis and clarification of existing theoretical constructs and models, description of previous studies and their continuity regarding the issue)
- Results / Conclusions (comparison, identification of contradictions, demonstration of the advantages of one product over another, conclusions, and research prospects)
- Discussion / Conclusion (relating theoretical or practical statements to the research results, proposals for overcoming the problem, and the significance of the research for theory and/or practice).

**2. For empirical articles** using theoretical and practical methods (measurement, observation, experiment, etc.) to create a new product:

- Introduction (relevance of the research topic, problem formulation, history of the issue);
- Research Methodology (research stages, research base, sample description, research methods and techniques, hypothesis);
- Results (description of results, indication of significance levels, result analysis);
- Conclusion / Findings (key conclusion, research significance).

### Article Formatting Requirements:

1. The text should be submitted electronically in \*.doc or \*.docx format. Files in other formats will not be accepted.

2. The article volume should be 5,000 - 7,000 characters (including spaces, excluding information about the author (s) and the reference list), page format: A4.
3. No more than 2 authors are allowed per paper.
4. The file name should consist of the section number and the full name(s) of the participant(s). Example: stud1IvanovI.doc / stud1IvanovIAndreevA.doc
5. Page margins: 2 cm. Font: Times New Roman.
  - o 14 pt – Full name (boldface font), title of the article (bold + uppercase), text of the article.
  - o 12 pt – scientific supervisor, educational institution, reference list (+ title itself – boldface font), captions for figures, tables.
  - o Single line spacing. Paragraph indent: 1.25 cm.
  - o List numbering is manual (not automatic).
  - o No automatic hyphenation throughout the text.
  - o Right alignment for: full name, educational institution, scientific supervisor, other author information.
  - o Centered alignment: title, references.
  - o Width alignment: article text, reference list, abstract, keywords.
  - o Page numbering: bottom right corner.
  - o Tables should be aligned with the width of the page.
6. Title Complex:
  - o Full name of the author(s);
  - o Full name of the educational institution;
  - o Information about the scientific supervisor – academic degree, academic title, position;
  - o Title of the article (numbers in the title should be written in words).
7. The originality of the text must be at least 70%.
8. In-text citations should be formatted according to complete bibliographic descriptions after the text according to GOST R 7.0.52008 "Bibliographic Reference."
  - Each source must be cited in the text at the end of the article, enclosed in square brackets indicating the source number in the list and the page number of the quoted source (if applicable).

Bibliographic references should be arranged in alphabetical order. Citing sources is obligatory. No more than 4 sources.

9. The text may contain no more than one figure or one table. Figures and tables should be numbered. Figures should have labels and tables should have headings.
10. The text must be original, complete, and written in a scientific style.
